

- The Valerie Fund is a non-profit organization established by Ed and Sue Goldstein in 1976 in memory of their nine-year-old daughter, Valerie.
- Each year, The Valerie Fund supports over 6,000 children and their families dealing with the social, emotional, developmental and physical challenges of pediatric cancer and blood disorders. We are one of the largest networks of specialized outpatient healthcare facilities in the nation.
- Eight Valerie Fund Children's Centers, including our newest center at Stony Brook Children's Hospital, are located in major hospitals in New Jersey, New York, and the Philadelphia area. Children battling life-threatening diseases receive top-notch medical care close to their homes.





Why We Walk

- The Valerie Fund Walk & 5K Run presented by Ed and Sue Goldstein & JAG Physical Therapy promotes awareness of pediatric cancer and blood disorders and raises funds to support our core services, which include child life specialists, social work services, psychologists, integrative medicine, educational liaisons and more.
- Since breaking the million dollar mark in 2012, the event has raised over \$12 million for our Valerie Fund kids. Thousands attend each year to celebrate the courage and resilience of children in our area being treated for cancer and blood disorders.

Diagnosed at birth with Sickle Cell Disease

"Kids my age don't often have to think in the back of their mind that at any given moment they could be bedridden for days on end. It can be hard to explain to others what it feels like to be in constant pain, to worry about every little thing that may trigger a sickle cell crisis.

It can be frustrating to feel like your body is betraying you and to know that there is no easy cure or quick fix.

Ironically, it is at The Valerie Fund Center where I am able to feel the most normal."

Meet Carsyn

Diagnosed with Sickle Cell Disease at birth

Carsyn is a Crescent Princess. This beautiful name comes from the crescent shape of a sickled red blood cell in those with sickle cell disease. Those blood cells aren't able to carry oxygen and need to be replaced with blood transfusions and can cause pain crises.

Despite all this, here is what Carsyn has to say: "Hi! My name is Carsyn. I have sickle cell disease so my life is a tiny little bit hard. But I deal with it anyway. I take medicine to help me but sometimes I have to go to the hospital, it's ok though.... that is part of my life."



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- Because of your support, The Valerie Fund began funding our eighth center in August of 2022 at Stony Brook Children's Hospital in Stony Brook, NY.
- Stony Brook Children's Hospital is the only Pediatric Hematology and Oncology Program providing services to the children of Suffolk and Nassau Counties. The hospital sees 60 new oncology patients per year, as well as 5,000 oncology and hematology outpatient visits annually.
- Because of the growth in patient volume, Stony Brook Children's Hospital will benefit from the expanded psychological support services provided by The Valerie Fund, including a Social Worker, Child Life Specialist, Psychologist, Educational Liaison, and Survivorship Coordinator.


Georgia has said that she misses treatment and I know that it is because she misses the people and the care she received."
